Mentor Foundation USA's Programs

Career Mentoring Program

High School seniors who have completed nine months of Mentor Foundation USA's program will be eligible for the scholarship as Career Mentoring mentees.

The **Career Mentoring Program** targets underserved high school students. The primary goal is to prepare students for post-secondary education, trade-schools, or entry-level professional success. Students engage in a college and career awareness curriculum throughout the nine months. This curriculum has three major themes: Planning for the Future, Developing the Whole Student, and Branding for Personal Success. Woven within those themes, students will engage in lessons that introduce them to skills such as: professional communication, knowledge of career fields, soft-skills for career development, and increasing self-efficacy.

Mentees participate in monthly sessions of two hours each. All sessions are facilitated by Mentor Foundation USA staff.

Youth Ambassador

High School seniors who have attended all Mentor Foundation USA Youth Ambassador training sessions and completed a change project at their school will be eligible for the scholarship as Youth Ambassadors.

The **Youth Ambassador** (Living the Example) Network's mission is to create and facilitate programs and activities that promote healthy life choices among their peers. The program seeks to empower, motivate and support youth to live healthy and productive lives, free of drugs. Youth Ambassadors for The Mentor Foundation USA are highly motivated youth advocating for substance abuse prevention amongst their peers. With support from Mentor Foundation USA, they will create initiatives to engage their peers and local community about the dangers of substance abuse. These initiatives are known as change projects. The Youth Ambassador creates and facilitates change projects that are constructive, meaningful, fun and engaging.
